Events Policy (ANU MSA)

Events held in the ANU Musallah:

- 1. Keeping the Space clean and tidy
 - 1. Food and drinks should be set up in the entrance foyer, food is permitted within all spaces in the Musallah however guests should ensure they keep the area clean and tidy.
 - 2. Event organisers and volunteers should clean up any spills immediately using the cleaning products provided in the Musallah, as a bear minimum, water should be used to clean all stains and wet spills.
 - 3. Event organisers are responsible for leaving the Musallah in a clean condition after the event has concluded.
- 2. Space for prayer needs to be kept available during all events
 - A space for visitors wanting to pray should be kept available and guests should maintain a respectful and quiet noise level so they do not disturb any guests engaged in prayer.
 - 2. An appropriately sized curtained area should be kept available for any sisters wanting to pray.
- 3. The gender segregation of the prayer spaces should be maintained during the event in order to respect any visitors or members interacting with these spaces during the time of the event especially those wanting to pray.
 - 1. The foyer may be used as a mixed space to serve food or resources.
 - The curtains may be opened as long as there is a curtained space for sisters wishing to pray in order to respect their modesty and the gender segregation of the spaces is maintained.
 - 3. Brothers should be respectful when using the foyer, as not to disturb the privacy of sisters who are using the sister's wudu area.
- 4. The Musallah must not be used for any events which violate the principles of Islam as accepted by the mainstream Muslim community.

- 1. Events which involve or promote the following are not permitted under any circumstances: Musical instruments, acts of immodesty or indecency, gambling, haram food, drink or substances (pork/alcohol), financial interest
- 2. Events must be respectful and must not involve the degradation or discrimination of any group or person in regards to their identity, including their faith, race, gender, sexuality, cultural/linguistic background. Topics which deal with aspects of identity must be kept within the boundaries of the Quran and Sunnah and must maintain respectful manners when dealing with sensitive or controversial topics.
